LAMP (Leadership and Ministry Preparation)



In obedience to the Great Commission, Pastor Brian Kelso and leaders of Christ Covenant Church (PCA) established, in 1995, a program intended to train laborers for the harvest. Brian now serves as MNA LAMP Director.

Vision

The vision of LAMP Theological Seminary is to see God, by His grace and for His own glory, through the cooperative prayers and efforts of Christ's Church, raise up godly men engaged in igniting a powerful church planting and vitalization movement that impacts all of North America and beyond with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Mission

The mission of LAMP is to equip men with the knowledge and ability to build healthy churches that will multiply throughout North America. To train men for effective Gospel ministry, LAMP utilizes a practical and reproducible mentor-based model that focuses on calling, character, and competency, as well as biblical and theological content. All of the training is done in the context of the local church.

Unique Aspects

What makes LAMP Theological Seminary unique is its commitment to equipping church leaders without compromising their family life, ministry, or current occupation.

LAMP is designed to meet the credentialing requirements for those pursuing ordination in the PCA.

The LAMP program takes six years from initial call to ordination, and averages around \$6,000 in cost, not including books.

Degrees are designed to integrate students into LAMP from a variety of educational backgrounds.

Accreditation

LAMP is registered with the Florida Department of Education to grant religious degrees and is pursuing accreditation with the Association of Reformed Theological Seminaries (www.artseminaries.org). In addition, LAMP has also filed for an affiliate status with the Association of Biblical Higher Education (<http://abhe.gospelcom.net>).
