Biographical Sketch

Wy Plummer and his wife, Shirley, have belonged to the PCA since 1982. Wy was ordained as a PCA pastor in 1995. In addition to his position as MNA African American Ministries Coordinator, he is also a member of the Advisory Board of Covenant Theological Seminary. He earned his undergraduate degree from Howard University and graduate degrees from Johns Hopkins University and Chesapeake Reformed Theological Seminary.

Through the evangelistic efforts of our churches, the PCA is committed to reaching the multitudes for Jesus Christ and enfolded people of every ethnic group. 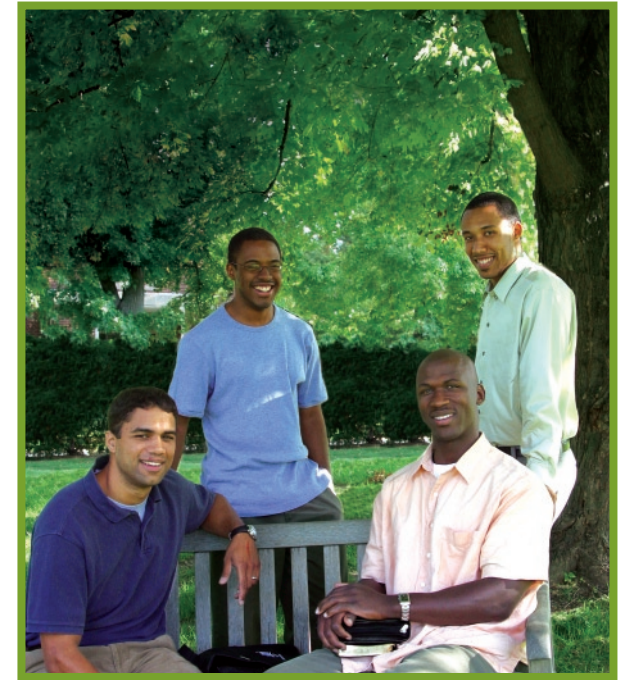
Goals
