Haitian Ministries

Mission to North America's Haitian Ministries is responding to God's command by planting spiritually healthy and Gospel-centered PCA churches in the US, Canada, and Haiti. To support this purpose, the ministry seeks to develop Haitian leaders with a passion for Christ, a devotion for God's Word, a focus on discipleship and church multiplication, and the ministry skills for dynamic leadership.



Vision

As the Haitian population in North America grows, our network of Haitian leaders will expand, resulting in aggressive church planting in areas with strong Haitian populations; the ministry seeks to provide these Haitian PCA leaders with services related to vision casting, recruiting, placement, assessment, funding, and training.

Dony St. Germain and his wife, Sharon, are dedicated to the cause of the Haitian Ministries. Dony grew up in Haiti and came to the US to train as an engineer, but was soon drawn toward the ministry. After receiving his graduate education at Columbia International University and Jacksonville Theological Seminary, he was ordained by the PCA in 1995.

Dony is pastor of El Shaddai Presbyterian in Miami, which serves as a home base for outreach and includes a school (where Sharon is principal), adult education classes, tutoring services, small groups and Bible studies, and seminary training for future church planters. He has also been involved in starting a Christian academy and four additional PCA churches, three in south Florida and one in Chicago. His brother Louis St. Germain heads up the church planting movement in Haiti, where by God's grace he has started a seminary and planted twelve PCA churches.



Why the PCA Seeks a Stronger Haitian Presence

Haitians continue to flee one of the poorest and most overpopulated countries in the Western Hemisphere. While there are 8.5 million Haitians still dwelling in Haiti, over a million have immigrated to the US. There is a tremendous need to minister to these people and to train leaders for church planting and discipleship in North America as well as in Haiti. In addressing this need, a number of indigenous leaders are being prepared, and Haitian movement leaders will guide them in planting a steadily increasing number of PCA churches to serve Haitians and lead many to Christ.



Goals

- To reach the Haitian community in Miami, Florida, 90.7 percent of whom are unchurched.
- To develop ten additional Haitian PCA churches in major cities and counties of the US that will become central in a multiplying movement throughout North America.
- To establish foundations in south Florida to minister to first and second generation Haitians, and to develop a church planting training center.
