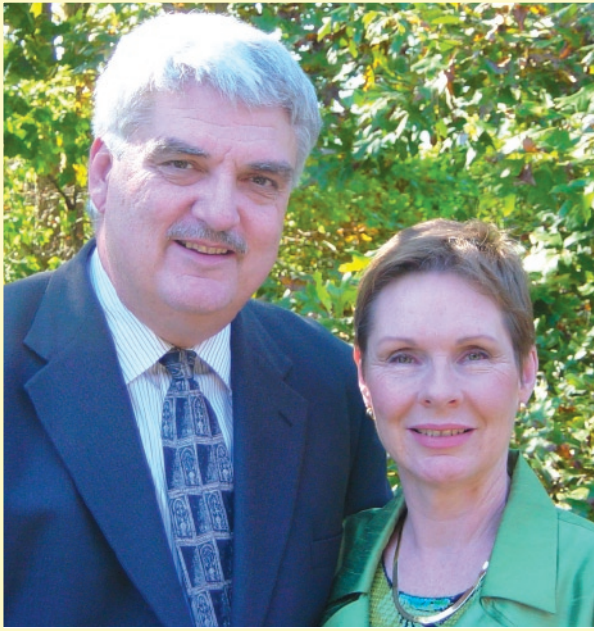


**Join Tim and Becky McKeown

Hispanic American Ministries

Hispanics are now the largest minority group in America and their numbers are growing rapidly. Restrictive US immigration policies have been progressively loosened since 1965. Since then people from Hispanic countries have flooded into the Land of Opportunity. Most experts estimate that they will compose a full 25% of the US population by the year 2025.



As members of the body of Christ we see this as an unprecedented opportunity orchestrated by God Himself to continue our PCA commitment to the fulfillment of the Great Commission.

Fluency in Spanish is not even a necessity in our North American context. Although the average age of the U.S. population is around 35 years old, Hispanic Americans are much younger, with an average age of around 27. Statistics show that about 70% of the Hispanic American populations in the US currently use English as their primary language.

Therefore, all that is needed for most churches to actively engage in cross-cultural ministry in North America are: (a) a sense of calling, (b) a desire to learn and apply proven principles and tools, (c) financial and spiritual support, and (d) a little outside help and networking once in a while!

The Vision of MNA Hispanic American Ministries

MNA Hispanic Ministries will work with PCA churches and presbyteries to:

- Help build understanding of the Hispanic population group(s) in their communities through the use of demographic and ethnographic studies gathered through on-site visits, research, and interviews.
- Assist in the development of vision and strategies that local congregations can utilize for successful ministries to Hispanic Americans in their local area.
- Lead in a prayerful search for workers to enter the Hispanic American harvest field and the subsequent matching of each worker to that part of the harvest where successful ministry is most likely to occur.
- Identify, work with, and train existing leadership within the local Hispanic American community while seeking those whom Christ has chosen and anointed for leadership within the PCA.

Tim and his wife Becky have life-long cross-cultural experience that includes military service with Laotians in the Southeast Asian war, sponsorship of Laotian refugees during their seminary years, and 21 years of Hispanic church planting leadership in Ecuador and Colombia.
