THE DREAM

Do I need to announce it to you? I think not! Our North American population is rapidly changing. By the year 2050 almost 1 in 3 Americans will be Hispanic. Now, imagine a movement of PCA churches and presbyteries reaching the Hispanic Harvest through launching biblically healthy churches! As the MNA Hispanic American Ministries Coordinator, I am passionate about trusting God to see such a movement realized. A movement of this magnitude has to be fueled by a strong team of committed leaders. I will work closely with a group of PCA Hispanic and Anglo key leaders committed to see this dream become a reality.

Our vision: To create a movement of PCA churches and presbyteries reaching all generations of Hispanics in the United States and Canada.

In fulfillment of this vision, our hope is to see three things: 1) A steadily growing number of PCA churches engaged in greater ministry development among the Hispanic peoples in their community; 2) A growing number of new leaders trained, equipped and empowered to serve the burgeoning Hispanic population in the United States and Canada; 3) Adequate resources and networking for the growing number of leaders, ministries and churches ministering among Hispanics in the PCA. These provide the bench marks we need to measure our fruitfulness.

THE HISPANIC HARVEST



Do you ever wonder what prompted such a massive influx of Hispanic peoples? United States immigration policies have been progressively loosened since 1965. Since then, people from Hispanic countries have flooded into our land of opportunity to pursue the American dream. As a result, Hispanics are now the largest minority in North America. Experts predict the Hispanic population will grow by about 200% over the coming years, while non-Hispanic whites are projected to grow at about 6% during the same time period. In addition, while the average age of the United States population is about 35 years of age, Hispanics are much younger, with an average age around 27. I see this as an unprecedented opportunity, orchestrated by the Lord of the Harvest, to continue our PCA commitment to the fulfillment of the Great Commission.

MY STORY



Born in Bogotá, Colombia, I lived there until I was 15 years old. In 1979 my family immigrated to Miami, Florida, where I lived until 1982. From 1982 to 1986, I served overseas in the United States Air Force. I met my wife Debbie, a native Floridian, upon my return to Florida in 1986.



In 1992, my family started attending Christ Covenant PCA Church in Broward county Florida where I was mentored by Pastor Brian Kelso. I'm a graduate of MNA LAMP Seminary, with sixteen years of pastoral experience, including planting Iglesia Principe de Paz in Broward County, Florida, and launching Grace International Church, in Atlanta, Georgia, which merged with Christos Community when I joined the staff of MNA in January 2011 as Hispanic American Ministries Coordinator.



God has blessed me with experience in church planting and a bilingual and bicultural background, equipping me in a unique way for this work. I'm very excited to serve the Lord and our denomination in this capacity and would like for you to partner with me in reaching the Hispanic Harvest in North America.
