## Ministry to State - Vision



People who work in the government of a province, state, or nation have an enormous amount of influence on the lives of others. The Scriptures recount numerous stories of God's people, equipped with the Gospel, engaging with those in positions of power, yet ministry to government is an unfamiliar concept to many.

**MNA's Ministry to State exists to develop ministry to government, with five fundamental objectives:**

1. To expose those serving in the government to the transforming truths of the Gospel;
2. To provide encouragement and support in the development of a biblical world and life view for those in government who make a profession of faith;
3. To establish and maintain a biblical conscience in the government community as public policy is created and implemented;
4. To provide a healthy and non-partisan means of connecting the church and the government community;
5. To promote and facilitate specific and intelligent prayer by the body of Christ for those serving in government.

## Strategy

Using Washington, D.C., as the international base, MNA Ministry to State will continue to develop in three major theaters:

**State Capitols.** Ministry to State is dedicated to assisting interested pastors and their congregations in the development and implementation of ministry to their state government center.

**Washington, D.C.** The opportunities for ministry are unending in the nation's capital. Work focuses on building relationships through meetings with those who work on Capitol Hill, in federal agencies, the Pentagon, think tanks, diplomatic communities, and the UN's World Bank. Over time, these relationships provide a forum for dialogue centering upon spiritual concerns. In addition, the ministry assists senior congressional staff members in holding annual state prayer breakfasts.

**International Capitols.** Through the Mission to the World (MTW) network, interested leaders are encouraged to consider ways in which they can build relationships that better their region's governmental communities.



## Ministry to State Director

To help advance Ministry to State's strategy, Chuck Garriott serves as Ministry Director. Over the past twelve years, Chuck has had extensive experience in international ministry and in preaching and teaching in churches and schools in Central Europe, the Middle East, Haiti, and South Africa.



In response to the Oklahoma City bombing in 1995, Chuck was part of a clergy team that ministered to families who had lost loved ones in the tragedy. This civic outreach was followed by the development of a ministry to the Oklahoma state government called Capitol Service. Through this ministry Chuck led a Bible study in the capitol and met weekly with state senators and house members for prayer and study. Chuck received his MDiv degree from Covenant Theological Seminary in St. Louis in 1979, and was ordained as a PCA minister in 1980. In 1983 Chuck answered the call to become Pastor of Heritage Presbyterian Church in Oklahoma City, OK, where he served for 21 years.

Chuck and his wife, Debby, reside in Washington, D.C. They have four children and two grandchildren.
