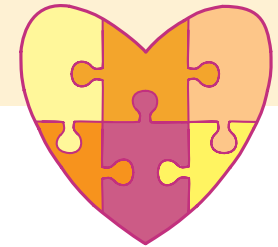

## Why We Need Special Needs Ministries

When we read about how Jesus engaged people with disabilities, or reflect on Paul's passages on the value of diversity in the Body of Christ, or realize the centrality of the image of God (in every person) to the message of the Scripture—how has the Church, for so many years, missed the opportunity to minister to and alongside people touched by disability? The Church as she often operates today is essentially disabled. She is attempting to function without all of her intended parts.

Many PCA churches are seeking to reach out to people in their communities by sharing the Gospel in word and deed. People with disabilities live in every community in America—but we have to choose to see them first. MNA Special Needs Ministries is here to serve PCA churches—by helping them to see people with disabilities as people first. People in need of the Gospel. People requiring practical supports and genuine encouragement. And people with tremendous God-given gifts to share.

## Our Vision and Mission

The vision of MNA Special Needs Ministries is “to see the Body of Christ made more complete through evangelizing and authentically integrating people with differing abilities into the life and mission of the PCA.”



Our mission is “to engage, educate, equip, and encourage PCA congregations, presbyteries, and agencies on the ‘whys and hows’ of effectively ministering to and alongside individuals and families touched by disability.”

Often PCA churches are interested in serving people with special needs in their congregations and community but genuinely do not know how to start. By providing training, consulting services to congregations, and access to resources, as well as facilitating networking between PCA churches—MNA Special Needs Ministries plays a vital role.

Stephanie Hubach serves as MNA Special Needs Ministries Director. Steph oversees the ministry and focuses on consulting, conference speaking and investing in long term projects—including working with Covenant College and Covenant Seminary, in addition to developing new, reformed resources on the subject of disability and the church.
