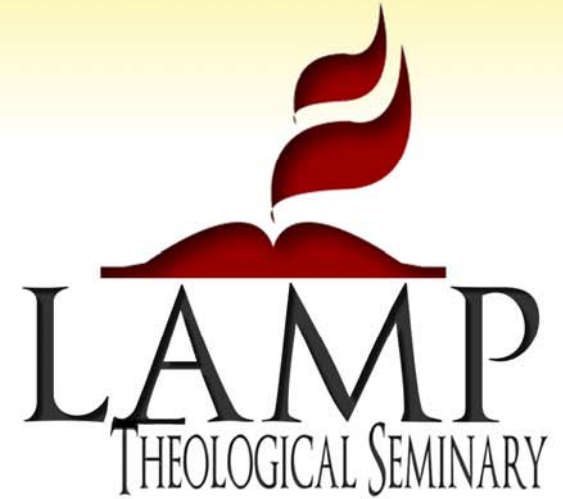

Establish a Learning Site

LAMP does not have a central campus but rather establishes Learning Sites throughout the country within the context of the local church. Becoming a Learning Site is easy. All you need is at least one student and one ordained minister with the proper credentials.

Block Schedule

LAMP has discovered that the “one course at a time” or “block schedule” system fits better into the normal flow of everyday life. This block schedule allows students to finish a course in approximately 6 weeks.

Step-by-Step Assignment Schedule

Each syllabus includes a step-by-step Assignment Schedule which helps the student stay up to date in his studies. Every course is divided into five components (reading, listening to an audio seminary lecture, writing, memorization and a dialogue session).

Dialogue Sessions

After completing the appropriate assignments, the student(s) meets with a Class Facilitator (usually a Teaching Elder/pastor) once a week for two hours to discuss the lesson material. Facilitator Guides are available to help the Class Facilitator have a productive dialogue session. The Class Facilitator is not a seminary professor; he guides the discussion to make sure that the student has a grasp of the material. The Class Facilitator is encouraged to share personal insights and any work he has done on the subject with the student(s).

Spanish LAMP

Spanish curriculum has been developed and is available to encourage Hispanic leadership in the PCA.

What Does It Take To Get Started?

Becoming a Learning Site is easy. All you need is at least one student and one ordained minister. The process is as follows:

- a) Submit Application
- b) List of local leadership and potential students
- c) Submit a strategy plan (what purpose will LAMP fulfill – i.e. train church planters, staff, etc.)
- d) Application fee
