ESL: An Effective Strategy for Cross Cultural Outreach in North America



God has brought the World to our Doorstep!!! Every city and town in the United States is experiencing an influx of people from all around the world. How should the Church respond to this movement of people directed by our Sovereign God? With joyful obedience!! Through ESL (English as a Second Language) ministries, the Church can now obey two of Jesus' great commands in one ministry. We can literally reach the nations (Matthew 28:19-20) by loving our neighbor (Luke 10:27).

ESL ministry is any ministry that uses the teaching of English as the starting point of sharing the Gospel in both word and deed. The hub of most ESL ministries is an ESL School. In an ESL School, conversational English is taught to adults in classes divided by fluency levels—beginner, intermediate, advanced. Other ESL ministries may grow out of your ESL School, including International Sunday School Classes, Bible Studies, Book Clubs, Mom's Groups, International College Student Outreach, and Friendship Partners. Volunteers do not need to speak the language of their students since only English is spoken in the classroom. All that is needed is to speak English and love Jesus and we can teach you the rest!!

Steps to Starting an ESL Ministry

- 1. See the need.** The ethnic composition of your town or city is rapidly changing, and a great way to reach out is through free English classes.
- 2. Get your church leadership on board.** Share your vision of starting an ESL ministry with the appropriate leadership at your church.
- 3. Create a prayer base.** A solid prayer foundation is essential for the success of your ESL ministry. Get your church and friends involved in regular prayer for your ministry.
- 4. Recruit volunteers.** It is helpful if you can recruit at least 7 volunteers. That way you can staff 3 classes (beginner, intermediate, and advanced) with 2 teachers each and have a director.
- 5. Train the volunteers.** A basic ESL Teacher Training course will prepare you and your volunteers for the classroom.
- 6. Make necessary decisions.** Number of classes offered, location, day and time, and curriculum will be important considerations.
- 7. Advertise.** Create and distribute a brochure in your community in such places as the public library and grocery stores.
- 8. Start your ministry.** Whether you start with a bang or begin slowly and build, God has a plan for you and your church to reach the nations among us.
