

Presbyterian and Reformed Commission on Chaplains
and Military Personnel (PRCC):
Presbytery/Classis Checklist

Member churches of the PRCCMP (see list below) may have men who seek a Call to be a chaplain. Chaplain positions can be in a military or civilian setting and can be full-time or part-time. A Call to chaplaincy ministry is an acceptable call for ordination.

It is important to know that the PRCC is designated by each member denomination to be the ONLY authorized source of Ecclesiastical Endorsement to any chaplaincy position (military and civilian).

This checklist is intended to help Stated Clerks have essential information to know how to proceed when a man seeks a Call to be a chaplain.
