Nashville's need & opportunities:

10%

Many have noted that 10% is normally a tipping point in a movement where things begin to gain traction & momentum. With a conservative estimate*, we would need at least 60 more churches (NET) averaging 300/church in Nashville Metro alone working together to move to a 10% tipping point.

Nashville's unique challenges:

- The “Dark Side” of Originality / Innovation
 - *Everyone doing what is right in their own eyes*
- Weak Central Structures - i.e. Presbytery
 - *Overwhelming # of plants that have “made it” were from individual churches. Presbytery has dismal track record.*
 - *For too long we have “wished” for a court to become a catalyst.*
- History of poor relational health / lack of collaboration
 - *A lot of good/true/beautiful stuff going on, but in silos*
