


Seattle is the least-religious large metro

In the Seattle area, around 64% of adults never attend a religious service, or go less than once a year.



Seattle is No.1 least religious area in the USA.





WHY EASTSIDE?

The target area is the
Northeast of the Seattle
Metro known as the
Eastside, specifically
Kirkland, Bothell, Bellevue,
Redmond and Northeast
King County.

- The area is affluent, family friendly, and home to many corporate headquarters. This part of king County is diverse and home to multi-ethnic young families with children.
- Approximately 31% of population is Asian, of which 11-14% is from India.
- Prominently, the area is home to the families of tech workers from India and other South and East Asian countries due to its proximity to the Microsoft headquarters in Redmond and many other tech-businesses in Bellevue area.

In the Lake Washington School District 69% of school age children are of Asian origin, particularly from India, China and Korea.

South Asian represent the largest group of unreached peoples in the world. Every fourth person of the planet is South Asian!

- Microsoft, Google, Amazon, T Mobile and other tech companies have **nearly 40% of their workers from India**.
- Redmond and subdivision around Kirkland and Bothell are comprised of nearly 50% of Indian households.
- Majority of people from India are either practicing or cultural Hindu.
- There more than 20+ hindu temples from Bothell to Renton, impacting the culture as well as the rhythm of public life in the surrounding area.
- Financially well off white collar workers, most are in upper middle class



SOUTH ASIAN DIASPORA

- Large South Asian presence in U.S. (6 million+)
- over 51% are ethnically or religiously Hindu
- Linguistically diverse: No dominant language
- Multi-racial, Multi-ethnic and Socially conservative
- large cultural and worldview gap between parent and next generations
- highly educated

DUAL NEED

- Among Indian Americans, 18% are Christians:
- 11% Protestant, 5% Catholic
- Part of Independent or Pentecostal Churches
- Growing reformed church planting movements among Indian Americans
- Need for training leaders
- Need for training next generation seminarians

CONVERGENCE AND STORIES

- There is a growing curiosity about what churches do!
- We have met several people from India who became Christian in the Northwest in past few years.
- Hindu Temples in Seattle are warning against sending their kids to VBS and from visiting churches.
- A PCA pastor told us that a middle school student from india responded to the Gospel during VBS, only for his parents to subsequently visit the church and advice against having any contact with the child.

Why US?

Rev. Sagar Mekwan is from Gujarat India. Raised in a polytheistic Sufi family with a deep passion for religion, He converted to Christianity at age of 17 after hearing a sermon on Isaiah 53.

He was a postgraduate student of Physics-Electronics before receiving a call to ministry. Upon which, he began his ministry journey as an indigenous missionary in Gujarat, India.

He is married to Jihye and they have three children: Ellyn (11), Elise (7), and Elliot (4). Jihye grew up in a presbyterian home in South Korea has served as a missionary in India for five years from 2006-2010 in New Delhi and Gujarat post college. Jihye also served in variety of capacities with the Youth with a Mission in India, New Zealand and Fiji.

Rev. Mekwan holds an MDiv from the Asian Center for Theological Studies and Mission (ACTS) in Korea, and a ThM (Old Testament) from Trinity Evangelical Divinity School (TEDS). He is PhD candidate in the Old Testament at TEDS in Deerfield, USA.

He has served as a missionary and pastor in various settings in India, Seoul-South Korea, and in the Korean-American PCA churches in Chicago for the past 12 years. He speaks Gujarati, Hindi and English as well as conversational Korean.

Vision

Our goal is to nurture a community proclaiming the Gospel through hospitality and outreach to the unreached nations that have come to us in the Northwest.

- To make Jesus known by making the Gospel accessible by bridging the cultural gap and creating a culture of hospitality.
- To be a church sent to joyfully proclaim the glory of God to all nations, making disciples of all peoples by sharing the good news of Jesus Christ, empowered by the Holy Spirit to be witnesses of Christ's redemptive work to the ends of the earth. (Psalm 96:1-3; Matthew 28:18 and Acts 1:8)

Mission

To plant a multi-ethnic English speaking PCA Church on the Eastside.

- To outreach the South and East Asian tech workers from India and the second-generation Korean American families in Kirkland, Bothell, Woodinville, Bellevue and Redmond area.
- We plan to do this through raising and recruiting leaders who would commit to declaring the Gospel through faithful worship, bold evangelism, hospitality and faithful discipleship in active partnership with Northwest Church Planting Network.

"COUNTER CATECHESIS"

Tim Keller famously observed that the catechisms of the Reformation era served to counter the prevailing religious views of their time. Similarly, apologetics in the early church not only highlighted the greatness of Christ and Christian doctrine but also critiqued the surrounding culture and its practices.

Tim Keller - North American Mission: The Outward Move

As a church plant, we aim to be mindful of our postmodern context and the need for a form of counter-catechesis. This involves identifying the lies embedded in contemporary culture, exposing them through a Gospel-centered critique, and offering counter-instruction that equips believers to live out the Christian faith in everyday life.

Strategic Impact



1. Engaging Post-Christian Society

The Seattle Metro is secular and morally liberal in its approach to life. Self-actualization is the supreme good that many pursue as a default goal in life. Our goal is to engage and critique the culture with Gospel lense and humility, offering the Gospel as God's ultimate solution to life and the highest good for individual, community and the cosmos.

2. Raising Ethnic Minority Leaders

Eastside is home to many christian from India. We want to walk along them by providing opportunity to learn Reformed Covenant Theology and Worship. We want to create internship opportunity for ethnic minority seminary students with a prospect of recruiting future leaders and church planters.

3. Reaching the Unreached

Reaching ethnic hindu from India who have never heard the Gospel, who are fish out of water in the culture of Northwest Seattle and are experiencing cultural and identity crisis, longing for friendship as well as community. Primarily, through tutoring, friendship, counter catechesis and hospitality we envision raising up first generation christians.

How Will We Get There?

Prayer

We have taken about 18 months of intentional prayerful consideration towards church planting. In conversation with leaders of the Northwest Church Planting Network and the PNW presbytery, we have discerned this particular Call from the LORD and subsequently prepared for it.

- The Eastside is where the least religious metro populace and religiously and ethnically hindu from South Asia meet, mutually changing the other. It is not only a battleground for ideas but deeply a spiritual stronghold. Pray for apologetic wisdom to serve a modern day Corinth and Ephesus like society.
- When an ethnic hindu responds to the Gospel, there is family conflict and attacks
 from both immediate and extended family. There is an ongoing spiritual work
 and tension, and we covet your prayers for such families and for us to minister to
 them wisely.
- Most hindus from India have a stereotypical view of Christianity as a religion of
 the West. They view gospel work as brainwashing through means of physical
 gains. The current government in India has encouraged a hindu nationalistic
 fervor against Christian faith. We request you to pray for Holy Spirit to remove
 these obstacles, to dispel the darkness and for courage and Gospel wisdom.
